


Having FAITH in our Triune God! Trusting God. Listening to God. Obeying God. You get the picture.

The scaffolding and the large lift will grace our property till the work is complete, which will be sometime near the end of summer, or later.

We are also getting proposals for two other major projects: a new outdoor sign that would have a digital message board, and new front entrance doors to replace the aging and damaged doors. These projects will be funded out of the recent gifts

that the church has been receiving.

School is back in session and the Serendipity teachers and students will again be present at the church.
