




Thought-provoking movie scenes will give us plenty to talk about during three sessions of **Summer Sunday School** at St. John United Church of Christ.

I want to invite you to join me on a journey with Jeremiah. This two-phase journey will explore "Pivotal Moments in the Book of Jeremiah" using Walter Brueggemann's recent (2022) book entitled,

Returning from the Abyss. In a small group discussion format we will navigate our way through the book's 27 chapters of only 163 pages.

Each phase will last 6 consecutive Sundays. Phase #1: October 1st, 8th, 15th, 22nd, 29th and November 5th. We will take a long winter break. Phase #2 (Lenten season) February 18th, 25th and March 3rd, 10th, 17th and 24th (Palm Sunday). Each session will begin at 11:15 am and conclude at 12:15 pm.



BOARD OF PROPERTY AND FINANCE



July is here and we can expect the weather to turn hotter and humid as it does every year in our area. It is a challenge to cool the sanctuary for worship services as it takes from 4-6 hours to drop the temperature to a comfortable level. In the past, the air conditioning would need to be manually turned on at 5am or 6am every Sunday morning. To make it easier, we have installed new programmable thermostats that will turn the systems on automatically. These new thermostats are high tech and can also be controlled remotely by an app on my cell phone...what a great idea!!



A painting company has been selected to paint our sanctuary and they might be starting this month. That means that the sanctuary will be filled with scaffolding and drop cloths. Some initial repair work will be done to walls and cracks before actual painting. Thus, we will be holding church services in Fellowship Hall for 3-4 weeks while the painting is underway. The new paint colors will be lighter, and we will consider adding some additional painting embellishments after the base painting is completed. We are looking forward to a brighter and refreshed appearance in the sanctuary.



We have talked for several years about **selling the parsonage**, as we really have no need for it and we do not wish to be landlords. So, we are again consulting with a local realtor,

surveyor and real estate lawyer to determine the best method to sell it. There are some complications that will need to be addressed and we are hoping that those can be easily resolved. Money from the sale would go into our Memorial Endowment and then would still provide us with the income that we currently receive from rent. Church Council and the congregation would need to approve the final sale. If you have any thoughts on this, please let us know.



There is a **Workship Day** scheduled for Saturday, July 8th, from 8am till noon. As always, there will be much to do for all skill levels and energies. Come join us for fun, fellowship, snacks and of course.....some work!!!



We continue to work on many other **projects around the church**. The ceiling in the southwest

tower/stairwell has been repaired and the stairwell has been painted. Soon we will be re-working the choir room to Debbie's satisfaction. Other projects will follow.

Many thanks to all those who help wherever and whenever they can. Your service to the church and community does so much good and is so appreciated by all. Have a happy Independence Day as we celebrate our blessed freedom.

<u>Things to do before sanctuary painting on</u> <u>July 3rd:</u>

- 1. remove all pew cushions
- 2. remove all bibles and hymnals
- 3. remove all papers, cards, forms and pencils from the pews
- 4. remove all communion cups from the pews
- 5. take down and store the bell tables
- 6. remove the choir chairs and other chairs and furniture in the chancel area
- 7. remove all music equipment: bells, music stands, drums, keyboard, etc
- 8. remove all other stuff from the cubbies around the chancel
- 9. remove all items from the altar table
- 10. remove the black curtains from the chancel area
- 11. remove the electronics, microphones and speakers from around the baby grand piano
- 12. remove the table and bowl of faith stones
- 13. remove the flags
- 14. remove paraments, banners, etc
- 15. remove any other furniture or anything else that might be in the way
- 16. move all audio/video equipment away from the walls and secure/protect as needed 17. set up Fellowship Hall for church services: chairs, podium, sound system, tables, altar, piano, live streaming/recording, moving pantry items, etc
