From the Pastor

Thank you, dear Congregation, for the Pastor's Appreciation Day gift of the Massage Envy gift card. This very minor holiday was not created by Hallmark, as so many holidays seem to be!

In 1994, the American Christian organization Focus on the Family began promoting Clergy Appreciation Month as a national month of observance. In highlighting Clergy Appreciation Month, Focus on the Family sought to encourage the faithful to outwardly show their appreciation for religious leaders on a national level.

However, Pastor Appreciation
Day, set as the second Sunday
in October, is just part of something bigger. October has long
been recognized worldwide as
Pastor Appreciation Month, or
Clergy Appreciation Month. The
call to honor our church lead-

ers' contributions can be traced back to St. Paul. In establishing the first Christian churches, St. Paul advised the congregation to give "double honor" to the elders of the church who managed the affairs of the church well, "especially those whose work is preaching and teaching" (1 Timothy 5:17). St. Paul further urged Christian communities to acknowledge those "who work hard among you, who care for you in the Lord and who admonish you," holding these spiritual leaders "in the highest regard in love because of their work" (1 Thessa-Ionians 5:12-13).

Our "Christ Ascending" stained glass window is back home and is getting the last and final piece of the restoration completed. The old outside protective panels were removed and the new clear protective glass has been installed. The window is now much more clearly visi-

ble to the neighborhood and much brighter in the sanctuary. What a huge difference from before. A few minor touchups to the inside glass and frame and this project will be finished. We have asked Blanck Studios to also look again at the stained glass windows on the sides of the sanctuary and provide any recommendations for their restoration. Thanks to all for your patience and support of this major project.

Tuck pointing continues every week, and progress has become noticeably slower.

Staffing issues and illness have plagued the tuck pointing company recently, and they are actively looking for experienced help. The completed work does look great on the church building. In addition, new electric wires were run to the church replacing the old and frayed wires, and they are covered to protect the tuck pointing workers. Expected project completion has been pushed back to the end of November.

We have scheduled a Workship Day for Saturday November 2. Two important tasks to be done are the readying of Fellowship Hall for voting and the preparation of the kitchen for the upcoming Friendsgiving meal. We hope you can find some time to come and help.

We are in the season of Stewardship and we hope that you would prayerfully consider what you might give financially to the church and all the ministries we provide. We have a goal of \$115,000 in pledges. We have met our goals in previous years and hope that we can again. It is heartening to hear other members express their reasons for giving to the church and we hope that you too will joyfully offer your time, talents and treasures.







